





Before commissioning me, it would be best to check the rules governing coats of arms in the country where you would be displaying your arms. The way heraldry is regulated in countries varies greatly: From absolutely no restrictions to governmental control. In Scotland, for instance, we have an heraldic court presided over by a High

Court Judge, the Lord Lyon King of Arms, who is authorised by the King to grant arms. Whereas most people in Scotland can petition the Lord Lyon for arms it is a criminal offence in Scotland to


Where there are no restrictions, you can have a coat of arms designed "according to the Laws of Arms" (which means that they will be heraldically correct). You will then have arms to display. These are sometimes called courtesy coats of arms and there are private bodies where you may
