**TO ALL AND SUNDRY WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME**

**WE** Joseph John Morrow, one of Her Majesty's Council Learned in the Law, Doctor of Laws, Lord Lyon King of Arms, send Greeting: Whereas by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Great Britain, bearing date the 17th day of August 1672, and others in that behalf made. We are empowered by virtue of Our Office of Lord Lyon King of Arms to visit the whole Arms borne in Great Britain with congruent Differences and matriculate them in Our Books and Registers and to give Arms to virtuous and well deserving Persons under Our Hand and Seal: **THAT** the Petitioner's said father (born 1882) was the son of William Peyton and his wife Anne Elizabeth, daughter of J. great grandfather (born Witchford in the County of Cambridge 24 July 1844 and died Cambridge 4 March 1921) wife Mary Saberton; **AND** the Petitioner having prayed that there might be granted unto him such Ensigns Armorial as might be found suitable and according to the Laws of Arms **Know ye therefore** that We have Devised, and Do by These Presents Assign, Ratify and Confirm unto the Petitioner and his descendants with such due and congruent differences as may hereafter be severally matriculated for them the following Ensigns Armorial, as depicted upon the margin hereof, and matriculated of even date with These Presents upon the 50th page of the 95th Volume of Our Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland, **VIDELICET**: - Sable, a cross engrailed Or charged at the centre point with a pellet, on a chief Or three escallops Purple. Above the shield is placed a mitre pretiosa and on an Escrol below the same this Motto "**SEMPER PEREGRINATOR**" and for his lay heirs an Helm is set for Crest a griffin Sable stantant beaked and taloned Or and in an Escrol over the same this Motto "**SEMPER PEREGRINATOR**" and for his lay heirs an Helm



CLAN CAMERON; a confederation consisting of the MacGillonnies of Strone, the MacMartins of Letterfultay and the MacSories of Glenorris, emerged from the mists of antiquity under their first authenticated Chief, Donald Dubh Cameron. He married a MacMartin heiress and through this, or his own prowess, assumed the leadership of the tribes which later became known as the Clan Cameron. From Donald Dubh the Gaelic patronymic, MacDhonnall Dubh (son of dark haired or swarthy Donald) derived and this was adopted by all subsequent chiefs. The main seat of the clan was situated on Eilean nam Croabh (the island of the trees), a small islet at the northern end of Loch Linde. For a time, the Camerons were associated with the Lords of the Isles and fought alongside them at the Battle of Harlaw in 1411. Ewen Mac Allan (Allanson), Donald Dubh's grandson, received from James V in 1527/8 a charter of the lands of Glenelg, Locharkilg, Lochiel, and the Ross-shire lands of Rishorn, Lochalsh and Lochcaron. With these lands being united into the free barony of Lochiel, the title of the Captain of Clan Cameron became registered as 'of Lochcail'. Further lands in Lochaber were granted to Ewen Mac Allan and it was following this later grant that the seat of the clan was moved to Torcastle, once the home of Banquo, Thane of Lochaber who suffered at the hands of MacBeth. It is thought that Banquo's sister Marion, married Angus Camshron (Cameron) the first unauthenticated chief of Clan Cameron. The fortunes of the clan came through a maze of troubles in the following years which welded them into a considerable fighting force leading to the description as 'fierce than fierceness itself'. Sir Ewen Cameron of Lochiel, who was born in 1629, became known as the 'Heracles of the Highlands'. His first experience of war was at the great Battle of Inverlochy in 1645. He was a strong supporter of the Stuart Dynasty and led the clan during the dissolution of the monarchy by Cromwell for which time Sir Ewen moved the seat of the clan to Achnacarry and the Restoration under Charles II. He also helped to resolve the nearly continuous 500 years old Cameron/Macintosh feud in 1665 and was knighted by James Duke of York in 1682. When William and Mary supplanted James VII, the Camerons joined with 'Bonnie Dundee' at the Battle of Killbuck in 1689. When too old to partake in military campaigns, Sir Ewen sent the clan under his son John to assist the Earl of Mar in the failed 1715 attempt to return the Stuarts to the throne. Sir Ewen's grandson Donald, known as the 'Gentle Lochiel', raised the clan along with others in loyal support of 'Bonnie Prince Charlie' in the uprising of 1745. Although spectacular successes were achieved by the Jacobite army initially, they suffered a heavy defeat on Culloden Field, April 16th 1746 at the hands of the Duke of Cumberland. The Hanoverian forces raised Achnacarry to the ground and the estates were forfeited. (This purge and subsequent economic changes resulted in many Cameron families seeking new lives abroad). Under the General Act of Amnicity 1784, the estates were restored to the 22nd Chief, Donald Cameron, grandson of the 'Gentle Lochiel'. In 1857, the 25th Chief, Donald Cameron arranged to have the new Achnacarry, started by his father in 1802, completed. In 1858, Donald Cameron of Lochiel, MP, 24th Chief, made Achnacarry the family seat again. He attended the inaugural gathering of the Clan Cameron Association in 1891 and this has since developed into a world-wide organisation. He was succeeded by his son, Sir Donald Walter Cameron of Lochiel, KT 25th Chief in 1905, a professional soldier in the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders and also an Aide-de-Camp to King George V. In 1934 he was created a Knight of the Thistle. Sir Donald Humish Cameron of Lochiel, 26th Chief, KT CVO TD, upon his father's death in 1891, moved to Achnacarry. He too became a Knight of the Thistle in 1935. Lochiel and his wife Lady Margaret, hosted several international Clan Gatherings at Achnacarry. He was an extremely popular and much loved chief. The 27th Chief, Donald Angus Cameron of Lochiel, succeeded upon the death of his father in May 2004. He is the fourth Cameron Chief to be a Lord Lieutenant for the Area of Inverness. His heir is Donald Andrew Cameron - Younger of Lochiel. Today Camerons the world over continue to acknowledge Lochiel as their Chief and uphold the honour and traditions of the Clan.

## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

### **YOU MAY LIKE TO CONTACT ME TO DISCUSS**

**How do you want the information?** If you want me to create similar work to any of my illustrations, please e-mail me with the number of the illustration and include any text and graphics or logos you want me to use.

**Can I include photographs?** **YES** - also suitable heraldry, Celtic and floral borders, clan crest badges etc can be added from stock. I have artwork for more than 300 badges.

**Can I get a quote?** **YES**. Email your copy and instructions. Including required size

**How will I receive the artwork?** **The artwork** is sent as a high-res PDF. This gives you the opportunity to print multiple copies at any size. We recommend that you copy the file and take it to a professional print shop, or access one online and have it printed as a Giclée fine art print on a specialist paper of your choice. Giclée prints are produced using a combination of pigment-based inks and special papers, which the manufacturers attest will last for 300 years!

**Please be aware:** not all specialist papers can be written on. If the document or certificate is to be signed, inform the staff and they will make sure the artwork is printed on the appropriate paper.

**How will I receive the files?** **These files** can usually be attached on to an email, but if the file is too large it can be sent by a cloud service such as OneDrive, Dropbox or Google Drive.

**Will I see a proof before I get the files?** **YES** a proof will be sent before going to final artwork.

**If you are sending copy please do not send original material  
as documents may get lost in the post.**
