

# PRACTICAL CALLIGRAPHY

## Family Trees

I have now converted my traditional calligraphy into digital calligraphy.

**Family trees produced digitally have certain advantages over conventional calligraphy.** They retain the look of conventional calligraphy but are less expensive to produce and is therefore less expensive for the client. It is also comparatively easy to add heraldry, photographs, floral borders and Scottish clan crest badges, to the document.

Unlike conventional pedigrees, hand written in calligraphy, extra copies can be printed and in the case of drop-line charts the principal name in the heading can be changed for that of a brother or sister and then reprinted to produce a pedigree particular to them. There is also often scope to highlight one of the other names on the pedigree and print a new pedigree making this the principal name. Whole branches of the family can also be extracted and printed separately.


I supply pedigree artwork on high-definition PDFs which can be used by your local print shop. This gives you the convenience of having multiple copies at different sizes on the paper of your choice.(See FAQ's)

On the following pages are illustrations and mock-ups of work I have produced in the past. If you would like to commission me to create similar work, please e-mail me with the number of the illustration for more information or send text etc for any new artwork you wish me to create, and I shall send you a quotation.

It is also possible for you to have your pedigree laid out in a standard typeface rather than calligraphy. With this option you have the advantage of opening up the PDF and adding entries or making alterations. **To give you an example of this option Illustration 1) is a mock up laid out in this manner using 15 pt Arial. There are 62 entries on this pedigree and different branches can be colour coded. This tree will fit on to A2 paper.**

**"Where do I start?"** If you need to research your family tree many countries have accredited researchers. You should be able to get contact details from their governing bodies via the Internet.

Initially you will have to decide which information you will want to show for each entry. Obviously, the more information you have in the artwork the larger the pedigree will become. I suggest the minimum entry would have the full name, birth and death dates. Your researcher may well find wedding dates and occupations which also may be added. A note about a particular ancestor, photographs and heraldry may be added and Clan Crest badges may also be added from stock.





Full family tree showing husbands and wives, brothers and sisters of each generation.



This is a mock-up using a common computer font. It means that the client would be able to open up the file I provided, make their own alterations and have the pedigree reprinted.

**15pt Aerial. 62 entries and will fit on to A2 paper.**





Family tree showing fathers, mothers and heirs apparent of each generation with heraldry added.





Family tree showing husbands, wives and progeny of each generation. Photographs and clan crest badge added. To make the tree easier to read generation lines can be colour coded.




Portrait format pedigree with marriage and spouses mentioned in the text plus heraldry.

Simple baby's birth brief (Often given as a gift when a new clan member is born.) Showing Clan Crest badges, baby's name, parents, grand parents and great-grand parents. This can be reversed by showing the Grandparent(s) as the principal name(s), then the children and grandchildren.

## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

### **ONCE YOU HAVE COMPLETED YOUR RESEARCH YOU MAY LIKE TO CONTACT ME TO DISCUSS**

**How do you want the information?** The entries typed up in "galley" form and sent as a document file or a pdf, together with any copies of the layout your researcher has given you.

**Can I include photographs?** **YES** - also suitable heraldry. Floral borders and clan crest badges can be added from stock. I have artwork for more than 300 badges.

**Can I get a quote?** **YES**. Email your copy.

**How shall I receive the artwork?** The artwork is sent as a high-res PDF. This gives you the opportunity to print multiple copies at any size. We recommend that you take it to a professional print shop. The staff will be able to advise you on the light-fastness of the inks (pigment based inks are best) and suitable papers or access one on line to have it printed.

**For A2 artwork** or smaller we recommend a Giclée fine art print on a specialist paper of your choice. Giclée prints are produced using a combination of pigment based inks and special papers, which the manufacturers attest will last for 300 years!

**How will I receive the files?** These files can usually be attached on to an email, but if the files too large it can be sent by a cloud service such as OneDrive, Dropbox or Google Drive.

**Will I see a proof before I get the files?** **YES**

as documents may get lost in the post.**
